Launching Mission 2025

We are pleased to extend an invitation to a closing reception event at the Guildhall on Thursday 27th June at 18:00-19:20 (after the Commissioner meeting and during London Climate Week), where ETC Chair Adair Turner will give a short speech.

This event – marking the end of the Climate Innovation Forum – will celebrate the launch of “Mission 2025”, a coalition including Mayors, CEOs, investors and citizens in support of high-ambition NDCs and faster action ahead of COP30. It will showcase leaders at the forefront of the transition to decarbonized economies, with the support of Dr. Andrew Steer, President and CEO of the Bezos Earth Fund.

The event is convened by Groundswell - a collaboration between Global Optimism, Systems Change Lab, and the Bezos Earth Fund - together with C40 Cities, the Climate Champions Team, the Energy Transitions Commission (ETC), The B Team, WBCSD and We Mean Business Coalition.
